Lenten Soup Suppers

Haitian Unrest Reaches Our Twin Parish

As we have reported, the political situation in Haiti has been very unstable since the assassination of their President in July of 2021. Since then, armed gangs have taken over sections of the country, especially near the capital of Port au Prince. Our twin parish of Chuaffard is located in a mountainous region outside the capital city. Until recently, the area around Chauffard has been relitively safe. However, Kenscoff - the closest town to Chauffard - was attacked in late January/early February. Now the schools in Chauffard are closed as the village lives in fear.

January 28, 2025 from Father Raymond: "Chauffard's news is extremely sad. The bandits have come upon us, we don't know what to do. Chauffard's situation is really complicated at the moment. Many people are being killed in the surrounding areas. We are afraid for the days to come. The police cannot get to Chauffard and are powerless in the face of situations. Only God can deliver us. As I write this message, the bursts of bullets are being heard."

January 29, 2025 by Johnny Fils-Aime of the Miami Herald: "Since Monday, a coalition of armed gangs in Haiti have waged war on mountaintop communities above Port-au-Prince. Local officials say gangs set fire to homes and killed farmers and livestock. Three days after the siege began, residents continued to live in fear. . "

February 4, 2025 by Evens Sanon of the AP: "It's been eight days since Kenscoff has been under attack," said Mayor Jean Massillon, saying gunmen are going home to home and indiscriminately opening fire. "As we speak, they have surrounded the area," Massillon said. The dead include pastors, teachers, and children. . . Many victims are working-class people who tend crops on the outskirts of the neighborhood in the foothills of a mountain range. . . The attack on Kenscoff that began January 27 has left more than 1,660 people homeless, according to the International Organization for Migration.

February 12, 2025 from Father Raymond: "The surrounding areas are attacked by bandits who kill, burn and steal the property of the peasants. We are in agony. Given the situation, I am forced to close the doors of the schools. People are scared. Every day, they receive threats and the state authorities have done nothing to remedy this unparalleled savagery. I'm still in Chauffard. They didn't attack me, thank God. I do my job as usual. The church operates as usual. Armed men are everywhere, in every corner and only spread terror. The priest of Bongars and the priest of Godet have left. Only I remain who find it impossible to leave, but I'm here alive.

The health clinic operates. The agronomist continues his work with the tree nursery. We are waiting for better days for our country. Thank you so much. May God fill you with all his graces."

February 19, 2025 from Father Raymond: "We are all here. So far, God's gaze protects us from the wicked. We thank you very much for your prayers and the Mass. A big thank you to Father Galuppi for praying for us in Chauffard. Union in prayer!!"
