Thank You to Our 'Fraternity' of Volunteers!





We fast at the Soup Suppers; eating the simple meal offered and donating what we would spend on a usual dinner to our twin parish. Almsgiving is even more apparent as our parishioners donate their time, talent and treasure. Thanks to our tireless **volunteers**, we offer many fundraisers throughout the year. We are brothers and sisters!" He continued, "I encourage everyone to be committed to the cause of peace and to respond concretely to the problems and needs of the least, the poor and the defenseless. Our resolve is to walk side by side, 'brothers and sisters all,' in order to be effective artisans of peace and justice, in the harmony of differences and with respect for the identity of each."
